

SCENARIOS



1. Several parents are highly focused on their children winning competitions. They are overly demanding and exert pressure on the coach to push their children harder, which is causing the children stress.

2. The group has children with a wide range of skill levels, from beginners to advanced. The more skilled children feel bored and under-challenged, while the beginners feel overwhelmed and discouraged.

3. A few children show little interest and are often disengaged during coaching sessions. This sometimes leads to disruptive behaviours, making it challenging to maintain a positive environment.

4. A child expresses they want to play a different position in the team. The coach doesn't think this suits the child and has a few other children who like this position who are better.

5. A child never listens when the coach brings them in to speak to them. They are always messing about with equipment, talking or distracting others and jumping about.

6. Children are bouncing with energy at the start of a session, so they don't pay attention and can't concentrate on what they should be doing.

7. One child is overly competitive in everything they do. This is resulting in the other children becoming overwhelmed and losing enjoyment.

8. Children in the group keep making comments like "this is boring", "can we have a game?", "when is it finished?".

9. One child is shy and is hesitant to join in.

10. Some children face emotional or social challenges, such as low self-esteem, anxiety, or difficulty making friends, affecting their participation and enjoyment.
